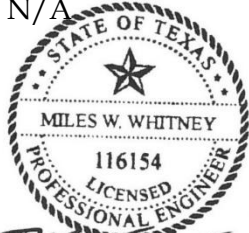

Discussion and possible action on **Ordinance No. 2026-02** ordering a General Election, authorizing the City Manager to execute an Election Services Contract with the McLennan County Elections Administrator, and establishing Early Voting and Election Vote Centers and dates/times of operation.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION/ITEM SUMMARY:**

Pursuant to the Texas Election Code and the City Charter, **Ordinance No. 2026-02** orders a General Election to be held on May 2, 2026. The purpose of the election is to elect City Council Members for Ward 1, Place 2; Ward 2, Place 2; and Ward 3, Place 2, in accordance with the applicable provisions of the City of Hewitt Charter and the laws of the State of Texas. The terms of office for these positions will expire in May 2028.

The City will contract with the McLennan County Elections Administrator to conduct the election. This agreement allows the City to share election costs with other participating entities on a pro rata basis. However, the cost per entity may increase if participating entities cancel their elections.

Staff recommends approval of **Ordinance No. 2026-02** ordering the General Election.

**ORDINANCE NO. 2026-02**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HEWITT, MCLENNAN COUNTY, TEXAS, ORDERING A GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON MAY 2, 2026, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING COUNCIL MEMBERS FOR WARD 1, PLACE 2; WARD 2, PLACE 2; AND WARD 3, PLACE 2; DESIGNATING POLLING LOCATIONS; ORDERING NOTICE OF ELECTION TO BE GIVEN AS PRESCRIBED BY LAW; AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF ELECTION SERVICES CONTRACT, AND ESTABLISHING EARLY VOTING AND ELECTION DAY VOTE CENTERS AND DATES/TIMES OF OPERATION.**

**WHEREAS**, the terms for Council Members in Ward 1, Place 2; Ward 2, Place 2; and Ward 3, Place 2; will expire May of 2026, resulting in the need to order a General Election to elect one (1) person for each position in accordance with the City Charter and Election Code; and

**WHEREAS**, the Texas Constitution, the Texas Election Code, and the City Charter are applicable to said General Election, and to comply with applicable laws, an ordinance is required to order the election and establish procedures consistent with the Constitution, the Code, and the Charter; and

**WHEREAS**, the election will be held jointly with McLennan County and other entities on May 2, 2026, to provide a convenient and cost-saving election to the voters in their respective jurisdictions;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HEWITT, TEXAS THAT:**

**Section 1.** An election is hereby ORDERED to be held on May 2, 2026, for voting in a General Election to elect one (1) person for each position to serve the full term of two (2) years for City Council Members in Ward 1, Place 2; Ward 2, Place 2; and Ward 3, Place 2. The Election will be conducted in accordance with the Texas Election Code and the Election Services Contract by and between McLennan County and other governmental entities. The first day to file an application for a place on the ballot with the City Secretary was Wednesday, January 14, 2026, at 8:00 AM, with the last day for filing being Friday, February 13, 2026, at 5:00 PM, in accordance with Election Codes Sections 143.006 and 143.007.

**Section 2.** The Mayor is hereby directed to issue the Order of General Election attached as **Exhibit “A”** as required by the Texas Election Code in the form provided by the McLennan County Election Administrator.

**Section 3.** The General Election will be administered by the McLennan County Election Administrator pursuant to an election agreement and a contract for election services. For the purpose of this election, all election officials shall be appointed and designated in accordance with the provisions of the election services contract. The Elections Administrator will serve as the Early

Voting Clerk. The City Manager is hereby authorized to execute a Contract for Election Services with the McLennan County Elections Administrator.

**Section 4.** McLennan County will execute Joint Election Services Contract and Agreements with Bellmead, Crawford, Gholson, Golinda, Hewitt, Lacy Lakeview, Lorena, McGregor, Waco, Woodway, Bosqueville ISD, China Spring ISD, Connally ISD, Crawford ISD, La Vega ISD, Lorena ISD, Mart ISD, Midway ISD, Robinson ISD, Waco ISD, Tehuacana Creek Water Improvement District #1, and Castleman Creek Watershed Association is hereby authorized and approved.

Early Voting for the General Election shall begin Monday, April 20, 2026, and end Tuesday, April 28, 2026. The dates and hours designated for early voting by personal appearance at the early voting locations shall be set forth below and are also listed on the Order of General Election attached as **Exhibit "A"**:

For purposes of processing ballots cast in early voting, the election officers for the early voting ballot board for this election shall be appointed and designated in accordance with the provisions of the election services contract.

**Section 6.** On Election Day, the polls shall be open from 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM. Election Day Vote Centers are listed on **Exhibit “B”**.

**Section 7.** Voting on the date of the Election and early voting shall be by the use of a lawfully approved voting system. The preparation of the voting equipment to be used in connection with such voting system and the official ballots for the Election shall conform to the Texas Election Code (“Code”), as amended. The specific voting machines to be used shall be provided by McLennan County in accordance with the Contract for Elections Services with the McLennan County Elections Administrator.

**Section 8.** Notice of the elections hereby ordered shall be given in accordance with Texas state law. The City Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to publish and/or post, in the time and manner prescribed by law, all notices required to be published and/or posted in connection with the conduct of these elections.
