STAFF SUMMARY:

A few weeks ago the Council discussed a proposal to increase the minimum square footage for new single family residential structures in Hewitt. The current regulations permit new homes to be built with the following minimum square footage:

- 1 Bedroom Home: 900 sq. ft.
- 2 Bedroom Home: 1150 sq. ft.
- 3 Bedroom Home: 1450 sq. ft.

The item was referred to the Planning and Zoning Commission to consider and make a recommendation to the Council. After deliberation the P&Z Commission recommended an increase of 300 square feet for each of the three categories of new homes. This would put the minimums as follows:

- 1 Bedroom Home: 1200 sq. ft.
- 2 Bedroom Home: 1450 sq. ft.
- 3 Bedroom Home: 1750 sq. ft.

This item did not include any discussion concerning adjustment to the minimum lot size. This item is being presented to further discuss the proposed adjustments prior to formal consideration at a future council meeting.

ITEM #4 – HEARING OF VISITORS

CITIZEN PARTICIPATION AT MEETINGS

1. All citizens are encouraged to discuss matters of concern with the staff and individual council members prior to placing items on the agenda. Many times this will expedite a resolution or allow proper investigation of the matter for presentation to the entire council.

NO CITIZEN NOR STAFF MEMBER MAY SPEAK NOR OTHERWISE INTERRUPT ANY MEETING UNTIL RECOGNIZED BY THE PRESIDING OFFICER.

2. To maintain decorum at public hearings, the mayor will ask the citizens present if they wish to speak for or against the item on the agenda. If so, they will be given an opportunity to do so at the proper time, when recognized by the chair. If more than five citizens wish to address the council on any single agenda item, those citizens are advised to select spokespersons to present their case.
3. Citizens who wish to bring up a matter that pertains to city business or address an item on the agenda may do so, but only under the agenda item "Hear Visitors." **The council is prohibited by law from discussing or acting on any item that has not been posted on the agenda.**
4. **Citizens addressing the city council on items not on the agenda shall be limited to five minutes each. Total time for presentations on any one item or topic shall be limited to twenty-five minutes. The city council members shall not enter into discussion on any subject not properly placed on the agenda; however, the council members may ask questions for clarification purposes.**
5. As a general rule, citizens may not participate in the discussion of the council workshop session.

Chapter 26, Section 26.05(d) of the State of Texas Tax Code requires that a municipality hold two public hearings on the proposed tax rate. This will be the first public hearing. The Mayor will open the public hearing to receive any comments and then close the hearing. Members of the public are encouraged to attend the hearings and express their views. No action is required of the Council.

2012 Property Tax Rates in City of Hewitt

This notice concerns the 2012 property tax rates for City of Hewitt. It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual tax rate the taxing unit used to determine property taxes last year. This year's *effective* tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. This year's *rollback* tax rate is the highest tax rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers start rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

Aging baby boomers face home health care challenge

CLEVELAND — For the past three years, Taura Tate's mornings have revolved around caring for a woman who suffers from the effects of a stroke and diabetes. She cooks her oatmeal for breakfast, helps with showers and makes sure she takes the right medicine.

Without the help of a home health aide, the woman, who's in her 70s, would be in a nursing home instead of living on her own.

But Tate has her own struggles. Until a recent promotion, her pay amounted to what she could make at McDonald's. She doesn't get health or retirement benefits and has worked at five agencies in the Cleveland area, some simultaneously, to guarantee she'll have enough clients.

"If they go into the hospital or go on vacation, you don't get paid," Tate said.

Demand for home health care workers is soaring as baby boomers — the

78 million Americans born between 1946 and 1964 — get older and states try to save money by moving people out of more costly nursing homes.

But filling more than 1 million new home care positions during the next decade will be a challenge.

Most home health aides are paid about the same as maids and manicurists and don't get sick days or health insurance themselves. Many who are self-employed must pay for their own gas for driving to appointments and cover their own medical bills if they're hurt on the job.

Fast growth

The U.S. Labor Department projects that home health and personal care aides will be among the fastest-growing jobs during the next decade, adding 1.3 million positions and increasing at a rate higher than any other occupation.

Some aides say they have no choice but to say no when people call looking for help because they can't afford to

take on someone else.

"It's hard because I love helping people, but at the same time I've got three kids," said Kimberly Ingram, a home health aide in Lancaster, S.C. "When you add up your miles, your gas money, you don't make nothing."

Her part-time job delivering newspapers pays better when you factor in the time and travel some home care jobs need, she said.

Nearly half of all home care workers live at or below the poverty level, and many receive government benefits such as food stamps, unions and advocacy groups say.

The median pay a year ago was \$9.70 per hour — 4 cents less than fast-food workers and short-order cooks, according to the most recent statistics from the Labor Department.

Agencies that supply home health workers blame states and the federal government for failing to increase reimbursement rates for Medicaid and Medicare patients at a time when costs are going up.

PROPOSED FACILITIES STUDY
